

Accessing Your Avid Ebook Purchase

For the best quality viewing experience, we recommend reading your ebook on a tablet. If you don't have a tablet, instructions for viewing on a computer are provided here as well. You can read your ebook on up to 6 different devices. Your ebook is secured using Adobe technology, and therefore you will need an Adobe ID to authorize your ebook reading app.

On A Tablet (Or Mobile Phone)

Install

Install the ebook reader app Bluefire; free on iOS and Android.

Then authorize the BlueFire app with your Adobe ID. If you do not have an Adobe ID, visit www.adobe.com to create one.

Tap

Tap on the download link in your email (or paste the link found in your Avid.com - My Products and Subscriptions section into your browser) to start downloading your .ascm file. This is a special file type that allows for a secure download.

Open

Open the .ascm file you just downloaded with the Bluefire app. When prompted to authorize your mobile device, enter your Adobe ID and Password.

Enjoy

Your ebook will instantly be delivered to your mobile device, so you can start reading immediately.

On Any PC or Mac

Install

Download and install the free Adobe Digital Editions software on your computer [by clicking here](#).

Then authorize Adobe Digital Editions with your Adobe ID. If you do not have an Adobe ID, visit www.adobe.com to create one.

Click

Tap on the download link in your email (or paste the link found in your Avid.com - My Products and Subscriptions section into your browser) to start downloading your .ascm file. This is a special file type that allows for a secure download.

Open

Open the .ascm file you just downloaded with Adobe Digital Editions. When prompted to authorize your computer, enter your Adobe ID and password.

Enjoy

Your ebook will instantly be delivered to your computer, so you can start reading immediately.

Accessing Your Ebook Exercise Media

Many Avid ebooks require video and/or audio media files in order to complete the exercises. We provide the media for some ebooks directly in your Avid.com account, but for others your instructor will provide the media. If you don't see a zip file in the Product Details and Download Links section of your ebook product page, you will receive the media in class.

Opening the Zip File

The media required for your ebook is compressed into a Zip archive file.

To access and open this file:

1. In your Avid.com account, click Products and Subscriptions.
2. Click the Show arrow at the bottom of the Product Details and Download Links section of your ebook product page.
3. Click the Zip file(s) you see there. (If you don't see a zip file, then your instructor will provide the media to you.)
4. Choose Save when prompted. The file may be saved in the Downloads folder in your Documents or User directory.
5. Locate the saved zip file and double-click to unzip it. Depending on your settings, downloaded files may automatically extract to a new folder. The original zip archive will be saved; check for a folder with the same name as your zip file.

Now do one of the following:

- If you are presented with individual files and folders (and NOT an ISO file), follow the instructions in your ebook for where to place your files. You may have a section called Using the DVD or The DVD at the Back of the Book, if not, simply follow the instructions within the individual exercises about which files you need to access.
- If you were presented with an ISO file after unzipping, continue following the instructions in the next section, Opening the ISO File.

Opening the ISO File

Depending on the ebook you purchased, you may have an ISO file(s) after unzipping your original file. The printed version of your book may come with a physical DVD, while the ebook comes with an ISO file, which is like a virtual DVD.

Just like a DVD, you can open, view, and/or copy the files off the ISO disc image. Since an ISO file is an exact copy of the original DVD, you can even use the ISO file to create a back-up disc of the files for safe keeping.

ISO files can be read natively on Mac OSX and Windows 8. If you are running an earlier operating system, there are many free programs that will allow you to mount and open the ISO file. While Avid doesn't endorse any specific product, you may want to try WinRAR or PowerISO.

Once you have opened the ISO file and see your files and folders, you can now follow the instructions in your ebook called Using the DVD to copy these to the correct location on your system.
